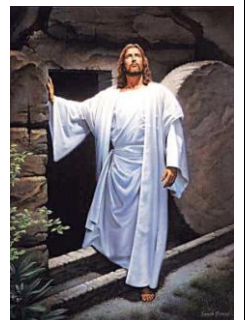

*Palm Sunday:*

Taking place each year on the Sunday prior to Easter, Palm Sunday is the feast which commemorates the Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem in the day's prior to his passion, as entailed in all four gospels. Before entering Jerusalem, Jesus was staying at Bethany and Bethphage; while there, Jesus sent two disciples to a neighboring village in order to retrieve a donkey and to say, if questioned, that the donkey was needed by the Lord but would be returned. As Jesus rode the donkey into Jerusalem, the people there lay down their cloaks in front of him, and also lay down small branches of trees. The Palm Sunday Celebration includes palms distributed to the assembled worshippers to commemorate the branches layed down before Him; left over palms are saved into the next year and burned, creating the ashes used for Ash Wednesday.

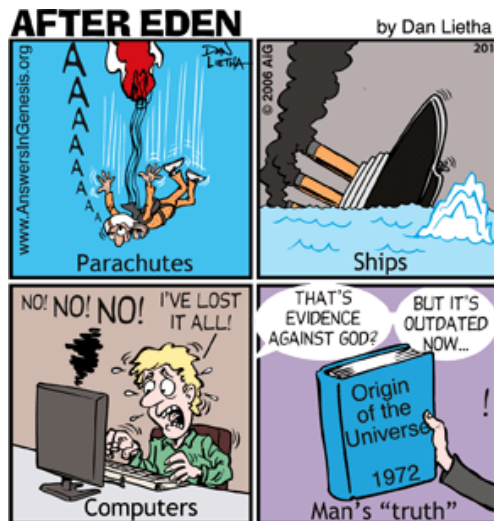
